
The Start of the 2008 Season

Many of our regulars have already arrived to start to fish from midnight of the 1st of June like Terry Oldfield from Australia and Ken and Marianne Sawada from Japan. There are also some first time visitors like Andy Murray from Scotland and others from all over Europe - keen fishermen from all walks of life eagerly anticipating an exciting week ahead.

After rising water on the evening of the 31st of May up to 2,20 m at the Frøseth Gauge, it stopped half an hour after midnight and started to fall immediately. The conditions on our high water pools have been near perfect, so it wasn't long before our regular guest Johannes Kahrs managed to land the first salmon of the 2008 season on the NFC water at 3.40hrs on the 1st of June. This beautiful silver fish weighed in at 9,7kg/21.4 lb./ length 99cm and was caught on our Beat B1 in Storen on a 12 cm Sierrakorva (Var.) tube fly.

The water temperature has been around 7 degrees over the last few days and rose to 9,5 degrees during the 31st of May. Our guide Simon Kitcher saw an estimated 100 fish in the Gaulfossen Pool whilst watching the Pool on the 31st of May for one hour. As well above Storen some fish have been seen by our team. Because of the good conditions over the last 2 weeks the salmon have also been able to run up the river above Gaulfossen and we knew for certain that at the start of the 2008 season fish would be in most of our pools on our lower beats and also in our Beats above Gaulfossen in the middle reaches of the Gaula.

Other interesting news is that Fish counts in Agdernes at the entrance of the Trondheimfjord initiated by the Norwegian Institute for nature research are very promising. A lot of big salmon were observed heading towards the rivers. For tagging purposes a number of large fish were caught and rumours spread that there had been 38 big salmon tagged, including fish of 25 and 26 kg (over 50 pounders) caught within a very short period of time. All fish have been released and are now on their way up to run the rivers of the Trondheim Fjord. 28-30% of all fish entering the Trondheim Fjord are running the Gaula.

Our expectations for some great fishing over the next days are running high – We expect warm summer weather with increasing water temperatures and a lot of new salmon coming into the Gaula.

The fishing on our Beats over the course of the first day of the season was quite enjoyable! Several running salmon have been seen in our Lower Gaula Beat on their way upstream. After Johannes Kahrs caught the first fish on our Storen water just 3 ½ hours after the season start, the next fish was caught by Ken Sawada. The famous Japanese fly tier landed a bright 24 pounder (10,9 kg) at 7 pm in our Beat D1 (Rognes) on one of his "Fishing Fire" tube flies.

Our French guest Fabien Laborde, who is fishing the first time on our Beats, lost at first a very big fish and caught a while afterwards a superb fresh cock fish of $27 \frac{1}{2}$ lb/ 12,5kg in our new lower Gaula Beat E1 on a Green Highlander Tube Fly.

Also Terry Oldfield managed to land his first salmon. The fish weighed 18.7 lb./ 8,5kg and was as well caught on our new Lower Gaula Beat on a Green Highlander Tube as well.

As number three of a series of fresh fish caught within less than two hours in our new Lower Gaula Beat, Chris Henshaw of Barnard Castle caught a lovely fish weighing 17.6 lb./ 8,0kg in Beat E2. The fish was covered in long tailed sea lice.

This was a good start of the season 2008 on the NFC water. Conditions are very promising, backed up with unusual many large running fish observed in the lower reaches of the Gaula. Fishing should be good during the next days on the Gaula and

reports from other rivers in the Trondheim region are boosting quite impressive catches.

In the morning of the second day of the season Karsten Kruhl from Germany lost a big fish in our Beat A1 – but we believe, we can report more positive news in our next website update tomorrow.

03.06.2008 22:30

2nd June

The second day of the season brought a more refreshing air temperature and the daily rise of the water caused by the melting snow was not so strong as during the opening day.

The new lower Gaula beat produced three nice fish in the afternoon. Fabien Laborde from France caught already his second salmon, this time a fresh, 95 cm long fish that weighed around 17-18lb /8 kg on a Green Highlander Tube.

Olivier Plasseraud, as well from France, managed half an hour later, at 9 pm to catch a fresh medium sized fish (82 cm) of on a Green Highlander Tube. Both fish were caught in our E2 Beat and were carefully released.

Another nice salmon was caught on a large Black and Green Tube by Thomas Wölfle from Munich. The fish weighed 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ pounds/ 8,8kg and was landed in our Beat E1 at 9:30 pm.


3rd June:

Tuesday, the 3rd of June brought higher temperatures and very bright weather and accordingly a stronger rise of water during the late afternoon. The water has been falling below 1,30 at the gauge and therefore fish are able to pass the Gaulfossen easy again. One of these fish was interested in Ken Sawadas Aquamarine Squid Tube fly and Ken stopped his upward migration at 10:30 a.m. in our New Pool. The fish weighed just under 20 pounds /8,9kg and measured 100cm.

At the time of writing another fish caught by Fabien Laborde was reported. Fabien caught this nice cock fish, measuring 102cm, with an approximate weight of 22 lb/ 10kg in our Beat D1 on a Black Tube. This fish was as well carefully released.



On Monday and Tuesday the NFC Beats produced some nice fish.

Falling water levels and rising temperatures will let more and more salmon run through the Gaulfossen into the middle and upper reaches, were the fishing should improve rapidly over the next days.

4th of June - perfect conditions! 04.06.2008 22:24

Yesterday late afternoon the water started to rise again, as it is still quite some snow left in the mountains, and due to the heat on the last day the melt water drains into the Gaula and it's tributaries so the river still rises in the evenings. The amount of snow left is quite promising and might supply us with additional water a good deal into the season, if the weather is right.

The 4th of June began with a fish of NFC's Daniel Stephan, a nice, medium sized sea liced fish of $15 \frac{1}{2}$ pounds/ 7.0 kg from our Lower Gaula Beat (Beat E1). Daniel caught the fish on a 8cm Green Highlander Tube at 9.15hrs this morning. He had another pull shortly before. The water temperature in our lower beats has reached 10 degrees now!

The second fish this morning was caught by Bruno Berthot from France in our Beat D1 at 9.30hrs. This is 33km upstreams of the Lower Gaula Beat, a clear indication that the salmon are nicely spread over

the lower and middle reaches of the Gaula. He caught this nice salmon of 90 cm length on a Scott ube fly and released the fish carefully.

We expect that some more fish will be caught until midnight. This is a very warm and sunny day, and the water is dropping nicely and we hope that many new fish will pass the Gaulfosssen during the afternoon. We will keep you informed.

5th of June - 7 large springers caught today!

06.06.2008 17:08

After a very hot day on the 4th of June the water rose during the evening up to 2m at the Frøseth Gauge, but stopped quickly and dropped again until the morning of the 5th of June. The quickly dropping water improved the fishing again and a morning of very good fishing on our Lower Gaula Beat followed, with a total of 7 large fish caught on the 5th June.

The first fish of the day has been caught again by Olivier Plasseraud. He landed it at 9.30 a.m. in our Beat E1 on our Lower Gaula Beat on a Phatakorva tube fly. This beautifull cock fish measured 102 cm with an estimated weight of 24 lb / 11kg. Olivier released as well his 2nd fish in this week carefully.

The 2nd and 3rd fish of the day took the fly exactly at the same time. Mary Anne Sawada hooked her first fish of the season 2008 in our Beat E2 on a Rosemary tube fly. Her nice salmon weighed 8,5kg. Simultaneously Bruno Berthot was hooking a fish in Beat E1. This cock fish measured 95 cm and was estimated to weigh 8 kg. Bruno released it carefully. Both

stunningly nice and fresh fish were played at the same time, so our photographer Olivier had to run between both of them to take the pictures.

After Bruno released his fish, he was going out again and it did not take a long time until he hooked another salmon in Beat E1. Bruno caught yet 3 fish during the opening week so far, all on a Jack Scott tube fly. But this time he got a surprise: This salmon had a tag — which is a very rare sight (see the picture). Bruno's fish, measuring 96 cm, weighing 8,0kg /17 ½ lb had the number X92056. Obviously the fish was tagged during the scientific tagging at the entrance of the Trondheim Fjord.

Our good contacts to the fisherman who does the tagging, made it possible that we are able to present some facts about this fish right away: It was tagged on the 25th May at 10:35 a.m. in Agdernes (entrance Trondheim Fjord). So it needed 11 days and 40 minutes to get from the outer Trondheimfjord until our lower Gaula Beat! That is very fast especially as it is a early running spring fish which has still plenty of time until the spawning in the autumn.

Michael Dahms, felt a gentle take at the end of the drift shortly after he started to fish Beat E2 and his first salmon was hooked on a Black-Green Highlander tube fly. This fish had a weight of 9,4kg / just below 21 pounds.

We are looking very much forward to the coming days. The water level at the 6th of June at 10.30hrs dropped to 1,15m at Frøseth gauge, so we expect good numbers of fish running the Gaulfossen today and that some fish will be caught in the middle reaches of the Gaula on our beats around Støren. The first two fish were already caught at the time of writing this report: Terry Oldfield got at 7:05 this morning a very fresh run fish of estimated 19 pounds / 8-9kg on the Lower Gaula Beat. The fish was covered in sea lice. Ken Sawada caught at 11:30 a.m. a nice 89 cm long fish in the Renna Pool. We will keep you further updated..../tr>

The water level on the Frøseth Bridge did not rise as much as during the previous days, just from 1,1m up to 1,2 m. So in this water level salmon are definitely able to pass the Gaulfossen easily. We also heard from the Guide at Gaulfossen that hundreds of salmon have moved upstream. So we are looking very much forward to the next days to fish our beats around Støren, where the fish should be shortly.

In the early morning at 7 o'clock Terry Oldfield caught a salmon of around 8,5kg (appr. 19 lb.) on our Lower Gaula Beat on a Green Highlander tube fly and released this fish carefully.





Also Ken Sawada was successfull again and caught salmon a of 7.0 kg / 15 1/2 lb.on his Rosemary tube fly on our Beat B2.




Ken Sawada with a salmon from Beat B2in Storen.

Our French group topped their own record (12,5 kg /27,5lb) which was held by Fabien Laborde until yesterday afternoon. Olivier Plasseraud caught his personal record in the afternoon at 5 p.m. on our Beat D1. After a fantastic fight he was able to land a huge cock fish of 1,17m and a estimated weight of 17,5kg / $38 \frac{1}{2}$ lb!!! The salmon took a Mikkeli Green tube fly and was carefully released as well!


During the time of writing the news we heard about more catches and some more lost fish during the day, several anglers have seen salmon jumping on our beats...more will follow tomorrow..

7th of June

On the Saturday the fishing has been slower than in the last days, even if the French group lost 3 fish in Beat E2 during the morning. One of the fish, hooked by Bruno Bertod, must have been a very large fish as it was running towards the other bank and the line got caught behind a stone or other obstacle. The strong fish draw out the line, running line and broke with additional 10m backing. Very unfortunate! Michael Dahms caught at noon a 5,5 kg (12.1 lb) fish in our Beat E3. In the evening the weather started to change, it got colder and we had a little rain in the late evening.

8th of June - Fantastic fishing on our Beats!

The new week starting on Sunday at 8 p.m. on Sunday had a great first day. With a water level of 1,20m at the Frøseth Gauge and with the certainty that several hundreds of large salmon have passed Gaulfossen in the night before, our fishing guests were eager to begin the new week. After out start meeting at Sunday 7:15 p.m. Peter Hansen who had just arrived, was the first successful angler and caught a 7,0 kg (15.4 lb) fish in our Beat B2. The weather forecast says the weather is cooling down to 8 - 10 degrees and a lot of rain will fall during the next 3 days. This is should be a welcome end of the tropical temperatures which we experienced since before the seasons start.

On the following morning the air temperature has cooled down to refreshing 12 degrees in the air, 10 degrees in the water, a cloudy sky with some rain showers – just perfect salmon weather...

Lutz Schepers from Germany hooked a fish of 10,7kg (23.5 lb) at 6.50 a.m. in our Beat D1.



At 9.30hrs NFC's Daniel Stephan hooked a big fish a the very same spot, but after 10 min playing the fish the leader broke as the fish had decided to leave the pool and was on his way to run the "Gauntlet" and Daniel tried to hold the fish in the pool. On his second go over the pool he had another pull and saw many fish showing in the surface. 30 min later he hooked

a big fish again, this time Daniel landed the fish after a hard fight, a perfect Gaula springer of 15,2kg (33.5 lb) a splendid short and deep cock fish measuring only 1,12 m.

Almost at the same time Mary Anne Sawada was catching her 2nd fish of the season 10 km longer down in our Beat A1 (New Pool). A beautiful female of 1,14 m with an estimated weight of 15-16kg / approx. 34 pounds. Mary Anne released the fish carefully. This salmon has been caught on a Sawada Orange Flame tube fly.

Also Andreas Witt from Switzerland, was been successful in the evening on our Beat B1, the salmon weighed in at $8.0 \, \text{kg}$ (17 1/2lb) as well. Johannes Kahrs caught a fresh salmon of $7.8 \, \text{kg}$ / $17.2 \, \text{lb}$ at $11:30 \, \text{p.m.}$ in Beat D1 on a Black and Green Highlander tube fly.

10th of June

During the night it was again Ken Sawada who caught two fish in Beat D1, the first fish of an estimated weight of 9,5 kg (21 lb) and a 2nd fish of appr. 8,5kg (19 lb).

On the morning of the 10th of June Bart Boendermarker from Switzerland caught his first salmon of his week in Beat D1 on a Green Highlander tub efly, a salmon of weighing in at 7,5kg (16 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb). His friend Leo Padrutt hooked as well a fish as well shortly after Bart with the very same weight of 7,5kg (16 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb).

Johannes Kahrs had a very good morning on our Beat B1, he was able to land 4 salmon estmated with weights of 8,5kg (18.7 lb), 8,5kg (18.7 lb), 10,5kg (23.5 lb) and 11,5 kg (25.3 lb) – he released all 4 salmon carefully.

11th of June – very good days for salmon fishermen....

13.06.2008 15:41

In the evening of the 10th the water stopped to rise after very heavy rainfalls at a waterlevel of 1,60m at the Frøset Gauge .Late in the evening our first time visitors David Swain and Ken Boomer from Ireland each caught their 10kg (22 lb) fish on our Beat D1. They both came to the Gaula to catch a fish over 6kg, and both did – even much better!!!

Short before midnight Manfred Raguse caught two fish on a Green Highlander tube fly, these were as well the first two salmon from the Black Pool of our Bogen Søndre Beat (Beat BS2). The very fresh run small medium sized salmon was estimated to weigh 5,5kg (12 lb) and was carefully released. Not long afterwards he caught another fish weighing 7,2kg (16 lb) on the same fly.

Early on the next morning of the 11th of June, Magnus Bäckman from Sweden caught a salmon of 7,6kg (16.5 lb) on our Beat A1. A little bit later Justin Maxwell Stewart from England has been successful on the same Pool and caught salmon of 5,5kg (12 lb). Manfred Raguse caught his third fish on BS1, again estimated to 5,5kg (12 lb) and released the fish carefully – this fish was caught on a Black Night tube fly.

Also Bart Boendermarker from Switzerland caught his 2nd fish this week - a nice salmon of 10,3 kg (22.5 lb).


Geir Espeland from Norway, who just arrived at 7 p.m.caught after 1 hour fishing his first fish on our Bogen Sondre Beat BS2 on a Garry tube fly. His salmon weighed in at 11,3 kg (25 lb).

In the evening the next fish were caught on Beat D1. The first salmon was caught by Dirk Ebeling from Germany – a female of 9,9kg (22 lb). Timothy Ebeling, only 11 years old, hooked salmon in the same pool and after a hard fight the fish was lost – it left the pool and emptied all backing from the reel.

Later Manfred Raguse was fishing on Beat D1 and caught 2 fish on just 3 casts each! The first fish took at 10:30 p.m. and was estimated weighing $7kg/15\frac{1}{2}$ pounds. The second fish was landed in the white water at the tail out of the pool after a exciting battle was estimated to weigh approx. 10kg/22 pounds, both fish have been carefully released.

During the evening Andreas Witt from Switzerland was able to land his 2nd fish this week on our Beat B2 – he released the fish estimated the weight at approx. 8kg/17.5 lb.

In the night of the 12th of June Bart Boendermaker caught his 3rd fish in Beat A1 (New Pool) on a Night Diver tube fly – he released the cock fish with an estimated weight of approx. 7kg (15.5 lb).

During the night the water level dropped on the Frøseth Gauge to 90 cm, which means just 40 cm over normal water summer level. Also the pools which fish best at "mid-June level" are now starting to fish well; And, in almost all our pools the guests are getting in contact with fish. The water temperature measured this morning the 12th was 8,4 degrees. The temperature dropped as we have had colder days and nights recently, but so far we have not seen that this have had any negative effects on the fishing.

On the morning of the 12th of June Mr. and Mrs. Sawada had good fishing on our Beat B2. The first of their 3 fish this morning was caught by Mary Anne on an Orange Flame tube fly at 8:00 a.m. – the salmon measured 99cm (approx. 10 kg / 22 lb). Half an hour later Ken hooked a fish – and was able to land and release a salmon of approx. 12 kg (26.5 lb). At $9.30 \text{ Ken landed his 2nd fish of the morning with an estimated weight of approx. <math>13 \text{kg} (28.5 \text{ lb})$ (measured 108 cm). All 3 fish were released carefully.

Andreas Witt caught the next huge fish on the NFC water at 2 p.m.. A fantastic cock fish measuring 112 cm and weighing approx. 15kg (33 lb) took his Sunray Shadow tube fly on our Beat B1 (Langoy Pool). The salmon measured 112cm and has been carefully released after a picture had been taken of the angler with his fish.

The fishing continues very good ,and all around the clock we hear about new catches and lost fish on our Beats. We just can say the fishing is great on the NFC water at the moment!!! Already we have caught 43 fish this week, and we would be very surprised if the good fishing will not continue and a few more of these beautiful fresh June Gaula Salmon will be caught until the end of the week on Sunday.

In a cold rainy night it was Lutz Schepers who caught the first fish of the day on our Bogen Søndre Beat at 1.30 a.m. He estimated the weight to be approx. 7kg (15.5 lb) and released the fish. Ken Sawada caught a salmon of approx.10,5kg (23 lb) at 3 o' clock in our Beat C2 on one of his Green Shimmer tube flies.

During the day the weather changed and it got warmer as in the previous days. The water level at the Frøset Gauge was in the morning at 80cm, so the water is slowly dropping and provides suitable fishing conditions on our beats.

The biggest fish of the day was caught by Peter Ericson on Beat A1. A beautiful cock fish of 13.5kg (30 lb)

Our Norwegian friend Jan Palmer Johannessen from Stjordal came over for a day's fishing and he caught a cock fish which has already been a few days in the river weighing $8.3 \text{kg} / 18 \frac{1}{2} \text{lb.}$ in our Beat A1 (New Pool).

Also NFC's Daniel Stephan has been successful again and caught a female salmon of 4,5 kg (10 lb) in Beat A2 and half an hour later a 2nd fish of 7,5kg (16.5 lb) on our Home Pool. Daniel released both fish which have been caught on the same Green Highlander tube fly short before midnight.

Dutch rod Leo Padrutt caught his next fish weighing $8.0 \text{kg} / 17 \frac{1}{2} \text{lb.}$ on the Bogen Sondre Beat 2 on a Black and Green tube fly at 3 p.m.

Now it is Saturday evening and already more than 50 fish are in the statistics, which is really good result for this early week. There is almost one day left and it will be exciting to see how many fish will be caught at the end of the week.

14th of June – another good day on the NFC water...

17.06.2008 15:55

The end of the week gets closer and some more catches were registered during the day. We still have a water level of 80cm at the Frøset Gauge, which means almost all pools are in fishable conditions. The water temperature is still around 10 degrees.

Yesterday our Norwegian guest Geir Espeland caught his 2nd fish for the week on our Lower Gaula Beat E1a., which measured 98 cm and was estimated to weigh approx. 10kg (22 lb). The fish was carefully released. Also Leo Padrutt caught a fish again on our Bogen Søndre Beat BS2, a salmon weighing 8kg (17.5 lb).

Hans Peter Fehr from Switzerland caught a beautiful salmon, measuring 1,07m and estimated weigh approx. 12 kg (26.1/2 lb) on our Beat D2 on a Sunray Shadow tubefly.

On our beat A1 it was again Dirk Ebeling from Germany who was able to land a salmon of 80cm on a Phatakorva tube fly. David Swain from Ireland had another fish from our Lower Gaula Beat (E2) measuring 90 cm. There were a number og big fish lost on our Lower Gaula beats during this week. Manfred Raguse lost a battle with a strong fish which took his Green Highlander high up in E2 and decided after 5 minutes in the pool to go downstreams and was lost in the rapids at the E3 Beat.

Chris Henshaw from Barnard Castle, who visited us already in the first week of the season arrived again this afternoon and could manage to land a salmon in our Railway Pool half an hour before midnight. The fish weighed in with 8,6kg (19 lb).

We just got informed that Norwegian angler Geir Espeland caught his 3rd fish over 10 kg (22 lb) in just 3,5 days fishing our Beats. He caught the salmon early this morning on a Mikkeli Blue tube fly and the fish was weighed in at 11,3 kg (25 lb).

The last few hours of week 24 are running out now and at the moment the catch records shows an impressive number of 58 salmon with a high average weight for week 24. We will keep you informed...

Our week 24 ended up with 58 fish, which is a great number of fish for an early June week. All fish which have been caught during the week have been in an excellent condition, absolutely bright, just perfect June Gaula salmon.

After our start meeting at 8 p.m. the new fishing week began and all fishermen who just arrived could not await to do their first casts. Our regular guest Arve Nilsen, who comes every year with his party of Norwegian fly fishers from the Bergen area repeated his last year catch!!! Just after a few casts fishing our Beat B2 he hooked a fish on a Black & Silver tube fly. Arve told us it has been a great fight and he could not believe himself that the story of last year is repeated almost similar. This time his beautiful cock fish weighted in with 15,2 kg (33 ½ lb)!! Last year he caught his personal record fish just 500 meter up streams in our beat B1, it weighed 15,6 kg (34 lb) – please see our 2007 season report. The pictures say more than 1000 words....

On Monday the 16th the Swedish author Pelle Klippinge arrived and fished our Beat B1 for a couple of hours and caught a salmon measuring 87 cm and weighing approx. 6 kg (13 lb) on a Sunray Shadow tube fly. Pelle released the fish carefully.

The night temperature has dropped a lot and we had a cold night of just 6 degrees here in Støren and the water level on the Froset gauge dropped to 70 cm, that means that there is only a further drop of 10 cm needed to slow the runs of fish somewhat down and than the salmon will become better takers. But if we get rain again, the yo-yo like up and down of the water level will continue and makes fishing more difficult.

We also got a report from our Bogen Søndre Beat where David Foreman caught a salmon of 11,2kg / 24.7 lb at 2 o'clock in the night morning.

We are proud of our high release quote of 65,07 % until now, which might be the highest in the whole of Norway. Even if June Gaula salmon have a superior taste and are exceptionally valuable food – our fishermen release most fish on our Beats!

17th of June –the prospects are exiting...

21.06.2008 18:26

During the early morning NFC's Daniel Stephan was been lucky and caught 2 nice salmon on our Free for All water at a water level of 65 cm at the Frøseth Gauge, the first fish at 1 o'clock was estimated to weigh approx. 5kg (11lb) and somewhat later he caught a second fish of approx. 8 kg (17.5 lb). Daniel released both salmon carefully. He caught the fish on a mid-sized "Thunder & Lightning" tube fly.

As well in the morning Masato Aoki from Japan, who fishes his eight season with us, caught his first fish of the week on our Beat D2. His salmon measuring 90 cm, which must have had a weight of approx. 7 kg (15.5 lb) was carefully released.

At 11 a.m. Chris Henshaw caught the first Grilse caught this season on our water. It weighed in at 2,2 kg (5 lb) and was covered in sea lice and took his Green Highlander tube on our Lower Gaula Beat E1. At the moment there are only 4 grilse caught on the Gaula so far.

In the afternoon Fabrice Bergues from France hooked again a salmon on our Free for All water. He estimated the weight to be approx 11,5 kg (25 lb). Fabrice released the fish carefully. We hope to show you his fight in a video clip shortly. During the early morning Fabrice lost after a fabulous battle a very big fish in our Beat B2, after 25 min fight the leader broke unfortunately.


In the late evening it started to rain heavily and the water began to rise.

18th of June – rising water on the Gaula


21.06.2008 18:32

The water is still dropping slowly, but it is dropping, so we expect some new catches for today, as many fish has been seen moving last night. 




During the night our Norwegian guests Jon Anders Schei and Jostein Ueland where fishing our Beat D1 – and it should be an exiting adventure....


fish 500m down streams has managed a masterpiece in fishing. There are few experiences in salmon fishing which make as happy as a successful run through the Gauntlet.

Also his friend Yngve Landro has fortunately been successful on our Lower Gaula Beat E1. Yngve's fish weighted in at 9,2kg (20 lb).








The last fish of the day has been caught by Franz Hochecker on Beat B2. His salmon weighed in at 7,7 kg (17 lb).

The new week started with a water level of 70cm at the Frøseth gauge. During rising water because of hard rain during the afternoon, Claude Verstreken caught the first fish of the week - a nice seatrout of 66cm on our Beat A1.

On our Bogen Søndre Beat the party around Hoagy Carmichael from the USA has been successful as well. Chris Patrick landed a salmon of 6,9 kg (15 lb.) and Christopher Russel caught a fish of 10 kg (22 lb.)

In the morning of the 1st of July Roberto Grazzini caught a salmon of 10kg (22 lb.) on our Beat B2. During this night Toby Gray lost a large fish on our Beat D1 which went out of the pool, down the "gauntlet" with 300 yards backing out. Chris Patrick from England caught his 2nd fish of 3,7 kg (8 lb) on our Bogen Søndre Beat.

The following day – the 3rd of July should be better on our water. First Kent Håkanson released a salmon of approx. 10kg (22 lb.) on our Beat A1 at noon. Two hours later it was again Roberto Grazzini from Italy who caught his 2nd fish above 10 kg (22 lb.) during this week. His fish weighed in with a weight of 10,5 kg (23 lb) and was caught on our Beat B2. Leo Niemantsverdriet from Holland, caught a small fish of 2.9kg (6.5 lb).

The next night of the 4th of July will be a memorable experience for our Belgium guest Jean Luc Verstraeten. He was able to land, after a hard fight on our Beat D1, a salmon of 8.7 kg (19 lb). On our Bogen Søndre Beat David Beazly from England released a grilse of approx. 2 kg (4.5 lb.) but the fishing in general has not been as good as it usually is in week 27 on the Gaula.

On the 5th of July Roland Schwan from Germany caught a salmon of 5,1 kg(11 lb) on our Beat B2, also Leo Niemantsverdriet has been successful again and caught a nice salmon of 9,1 kg (20 lb.) on our Beat C2. Jonathan Argent caught a grilse of 1,5 kg (3.5 lb) on our Beat D2. Magnus Beckmann released a fish of approx. 5kg (11 lb) on our Beat D1

A lot og fish have been seen during the week in all of our pools, but the catches have not been so good, there is no doubt, the reason was the high water temperature of up to 19 degrees!!! which we measured on the evening of the 5th of July, but the weather forecast for the following days sounds promising and on the next morning everything looked better – a cloudy sky, colder air and a little bit wind. It was easy to anticipate that this change to colder weather should improve the fishing on the NFC water: It started with a small grilse caught by Shusuke Hirano on Beat A1. Johan Wallestad from Sweden just pulled out his line on beat C2 and a salmon took his fly on his first cast - a nice salmon of 9,1 kg (20 lb.) which gave him an unbelievable fight.

Shusuke Hirano caught his 2nd grilse during the afternoon and Marcus Thomasson was able to land two salmon, the first fish of estimated 4,5 kg (10 lb) which he carefully released and the 2nd fish for him this afternoon weighed in at 10.3 kg (23 lb) (picture on the top). Marcus just fished one hour on Beat B2.

We are looking forward to the coming week as the weather forecast promises colder temperatures and the great final weekend with good catches and several lost fish let us hope for a good week 28 on the NFC Beats starting this evening at 8 p. m...

Week 28 – 6th to 8th of July - very good days on the NFC water.... 10.07.2008 01:33

After the weather cooled down last weekend with an immediate positive effect on the fishing on last Sunday stronger rainfalls started resulting in a nice rise of the water level of 70 cm from 0.30 to 1m at the Frøseth gauge. During this rising water first Siegfried Schneid from Munich caught the first fish of the week on Beat C2 - a small salmon of 2,8 kg. Douglas Beveridge fished our Beat D1 and lost a fish after 2 hours fight during the night, the fish left the pool and was lost 400m downstream after he ran the "gauntlet". Douglas estimated this fish to weigh over 20kg, he said this fish just has been huge!!!



On the next morning Jürgen Ruhland from Germany caught a grilse weighing 1,5 kg on our Beat B2 and also Sven Nedved caught a fish with the same size at noon. Manfred Raguse fished Beat D1 just before noon on Monday and carefully released a sea liced salmon measuring 94cm and weighing approx. 9kg/20 lb. The fish was caught on a small Green Highlander tube. His underwater photograph of the fish shows clearly some marks on top of the head which occurred whilst he was playing the fish and the line was wrapped around the head. This is often dangerous as the line might cut the gills which fortunately did not happen this time and the fish went back strong and in splendid condition. On the same pool a grilse of approx. 2 kg been released by Stefan Gross in the afternoon. Theo Ripplinger fished with him together and caught a salmon of 5,5kg/12 lb. in the afternoon. Also Siegfried Schneid was successful again and caught his 2nd fish of the week, a grilse of approx. 2,5kg/5 ½ lb..

We are very happy to see now increasing numbers of grilse included in the catch. After last years shortage of grilse we are now hoping for good grilse runs this season as a indicator of a healthy balance between the different year classes of salmon running the Gaula. Last week there were only a total of 61 grilse registered in the catch statistic on the whole river, but during the last 7 days an additional of 61 grilse were caught. At the moment the reported catch on the whole Gaula River is 2.275 fish weighing a total of 17.603,05kg / 38,814.72 lb which breaks down into 123 grilse, 662 medium sized salmon and impressive 1.490 fish over 7kg/15 ½ lb.

Bruce Lindley from England had a good start of his week, he caught at first a fish of approx. $8 \text{kg} / 17 \frac{1}{2} \text{lb.}$ on our Beat B2 during the afternoon and later in the evening another nice salmon of approx. 9,5 kg / 21 lb. Bruce released both fish carefully as usual.

Matthias Göhnert has been successful on our Lower Gaula Beat and caught a small salmon of approx. 2,5 kg. His father Gottlieb Göhnert was able to release a sea trout of approx. 2kg later during the night on our Beat C2.

The water is dropping quickly which seems to have a positive effect on the fishing at the moment and almost all pools of the NFC water provide good fishing. During the night a salmon weighing 12,3kg/27 lb. (weighed alive) was caught by Douglas Beveridge on Beat C1. Douglas released the fish after a very good fight which lasted 15 minutes. Recalling the fight with

the leviathan which he played Sunday evening for two hours and which was never seen, the catch of this 27 pounder was perceived by Douglas as very exciting but not too difficult...

Week 28, continued: Dropping water, but still good fishing!

11.07.2008 21:12

We are proud about are high release quota on our beats on the Gaula. In June 40,1% and in July so far even 65,2% of all caught fish were carefully returned. This is a great percentage of released fish especially for a Norwegian River and it might well be the highest release quota in the whole of Norway. Things have changed in the minds of the anglers who fish with the Norwegian Flyfishers Club. They want to support the wild salmon stocks. We have seen as well worm anglers or spoon fishermen on other beats who were handling caught fish very professional and released them carefully. This will help to increase the number of spawning fish.

The water is still dropping slowly every day, but despite the constant dry weather the fishing is quite good. It has been recently an issue on the lower Gaula in lower water levels that the river was digging on one particular place with the result that clay was washed into the river. This affected the clarity of the water at times, whilst at other times the river was running very clear. Anyway also in the coloured water it is possible to catch fish – but it is necessary to use bright flies in day time with yellow, green or orange colours – at nights black. The sizes of the flies can be chosen a bit bigger as in the middle and upper parts of the river.

At noon of the 9th of July Bruce Lindley showed that it is possible to catch fish on our lower water even when the water is colured. He landed a very beautiful sea liced salmon of 6,2 kg (13.5 lb.), which he released carefully as he always does. He weighs his fish in a "weigh sack" before he returns it.














Andre with one of his fish from our Upper Gaula Beat










